


The Constitution as a Basis for monitoring of Elected Representatives

- The Constitution defines their powers and rules of functioning, hence only the Constitution can provide the parameters for their monitoring.














Comparison of Top 6 & Bottom 6 MLA's in terms of Overall Average Score of 13th Assembly

In 2019, 92% of respondents in the constituencies of top 6 MLAs said that, their quality of life has improved while, only 44% respondents of bottom 6 MLAs expressed improvement in their quality of life. $_{10}$




The total number of questions raised in the assembly has **dropped by 42**% in this term (13th Assembly) as compared to last term (12th assembly).
