SUMMARY OF MAYOR SPEECH

The final round of **Mayor Speech** event for **Prajatantra 2021** was conducted on 28th of August. More than ever, the model Mayors were exuberant in their spirits. The finalists stressed upon the ideal changes required in their cities for modern governance. Well-versed with static as well as evolutionary problems residing in their cities, participants came up with innovative solutions to get rid of them. "City governance is science and art for me" was stated by a participant. He identified recurring problems of his city and proposed techniques to solve them.

Significantly, implementation of the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model was stressed upon by the finalists for developing better infrastructure in their cities. The event was also attended by three sitting Mayors - Vikrant Vikram Gojamgunde, Mayor, Latur City Municipal Corporation; Junaid Azim Mattu, Mayor, Srinagar Municipal Corporation and Mukesh Suryan, Mayor, South Delhi Municipal Corporation. Mukesh Suryan emphasised on the waste management issues faced by the citizens of Delhi and how the South Delhi Municipal Corporation created a plan aiming to solve it. The other common facets which were deliberately discussed during the Question and Answer round were security, digitalisation, focus on SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals) and policy implementation. As a concluding remark, the sitting Mayors encouraged the model Mayors of the day to join politics and increase quality of life by implementing their stated-policies.

Every Mayor must work on attaining Social Development Goals, not only to enhance their city's development but also to contribute to the country's overall growth.

This gave way to the felicitation ceremony where winners for each of the events in Prajatantra were announced. The amount of joy and ecstasy caught on the faces of the winners was delightful. With the applauding remarks of the guests and organisers, the event came to a satisfying end.

SUMMARY OF GRAND FINALE

The grand finale heat was reflected in each competition. As stakes were high, participants' energy and passion reflected in their performances.

Building on their past arguments, seven finalists, concentrated their arguments on the importance of the overall health sector at the hyperlocal stage. Arguments moved over health, as a basic necessity to the potential of medical tourism to financially boost the sector. There were other discussions on strengthening the primary healthcare sector to minimise the impact of severe healthcare challenges and health challenges unique to urban life.

In the other zoom rooms, policy presentations balanced ambitious plans with practical implementations. There were several improvisations in the presentations based on the feedback shared by the judges in the earlier rounds. Ruturaj Lende from Mumbai University stood out as he presented his mobility plan. He included several slogans such as 'Bhagao complexity welcome simplicity' and 'Ab har citizen dodhega'.

Representation of women in Indian politics is an unusual sight, but it is impressive to see the maximum number of finalists personating as Mayors of their cities to be women, today.

The idea focuses on affordable and accessible healthcare as well as provisions to fill regional disparities and inequalities.
