EDITORIAL


Greetings from the Prajatantra Team!


Participation Across India in Prajatantra 2025

Journey to the Grand Finale: Highlights from the Qualifying and **Semi-Finale Rounds**

The Prajatantra 2025 — National Youth Festival journey reached an inspiring milestone with the successful completion of the Qualifying and Semi-Finale Rounds, paving the way for the Grand Finale in Mumbai on 1st and 2nd November 2025.

The 7th edition of Prajatantra, co-organised by Praja Foundation, NIUA, and UN-Habitat India, with support from Rohini Nilekani Philanthropies and the Madhu Mehta Foundation, and knowledge partner VJAL Institute, witnessed remarkable national participation — over 3,800 youth from 674 teams, representing all 28 states and 8 union territories across 194 cities.

The Qualifying and Semi-Finale Rounds together showcased the creativity, leadership, and civic imagination of India's youth through various competitions and discussions focused on Al-driven governance, citizen participation, and sustainable cities. Participants demonstrated their ideas through speeches, policy proposals, debates, and creative Op-Ed and reel submissions that reflected their vision for inclusive and data-driven urban development.

Knowledge sessions led by P.D. Hari Prasad and VJAL Institute deepened participants' understanding of municipal structures and the role of technology in governance.


DIGITAL POSTER MAKING

Municipal Finance

Participants stepped into the role of city Finance Committee chairperson and proposed innovative ideas to strengthen municipal budgets and service delivery. Finalists presented practical solutions focused on revenue generation, transparency, and citizen participation in budgeting.

Many teams integrated artificial intelligence tools for data analysis, expenditure tracking, and financial planning. Judges appreciated the participants' analytical approach and their ability to balance fiscal discipline with citizen-centric priorities

SAMVAAD


